



- 2. The institution is also given a mandate for holistic development of the learners and to meet expectations of the society and to pursue all the expectations of its stakeholders.




## **Core Values**

- Our student Aditya Bukki of BCA(Science)-II participated in Sports events and won medals in it at different venues in India:




# PLACEMENT
